

PARTNERSHIP WITH RURAL WATER ASSOCIATION OF UTAH



When a public water supplier submits proof of beneficial use, one of the items that must be documented is:

- A) Show the water is needed within 40 years.
- B) Show the total quantity of developed water from all its sources and compare this amount to the total quantity of water represented by the PWS's perfected water rights.
- C) Show ownership of the right and that the well is connected to the system.
- D) Report to the State Engineer the capacity of the installed pump.


